Through a strategic partnership of technological integration with Ag Nav, Certified Irish Angus farmer members will be encouraged and supported by Bord Bia, Teagasc and ICBF to build on existing sustainability practices, while at the same time adopting new technologies, all of which will be aimed at adding value to the livestock produced on their farms.

Certified Irish Angus encourages its farmer members to join and participate in the programme. Ag Nav will provide a range of advantages including improved herd management, increased efficiency and productivity, cost savings, data-driven decision-making, and a competitive edge in the market.

What is Ag Nav

Ag Nav is a new agricultural online portal developed as a farmer-centric sustainability support system that makes use of the combined knowledge, information, resources, and tools of the three agencies, Teagasc, Bord Bia and ICBF. Ag Nav has been piloted on signpost demonstration farms. The aim of the portal is to help farmers develop action plans for individual farmers to mitigate their Greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) and ammonia emissions. An evaluation of the farm's current performance in relation to Greenhouse Gas and ammonia emissions must be recorded. Ag Nav displays total farm emissions, emissions /Ha, and carbon footprint or emissions output /kg of LWG. The value Ag Nav will provide for beef farmers is the ability to accurately measure and verify their carbon footprint showing the reduction when implementing sustainable actions at the farm level.

Relaunch of Certified Irish Angus School Competition

Now in its tenth year the Certified Irish Angus Schools competition is now seeking applications for its 2024 programme.

Each year, five school groups from around the country are chosen to take part in this prestigious competition and receive five Irish Angus cross calves which they rear to slaughter as part of their Leaving Certificate agricultural science project.

The competition encourages second-level students to gain an understanding about the care and attention that is required to produce and market the highest-quality sustainable beef for consumers. The students also receive unique opportunities like media training, an international study trip and opportunities to present to Agricultural industry experts.



The five groups that will receive their calves at the National Ploughing Championships 2023 are:

- St Clare's College, Ballyjamesduff, Co. Cavan
- Villiers School, Limerick
- Mercy Secondary School, Kilbeggan, Co. Westmeath
- Scoil Chriost Ri, Portlaoise, Co. Laois
- Loreto Secondary School, Clonmel, Co. Tipperary

Application Process

The application process encourages transition year students to show off their creativity and passion and to record an application video on a project theme of their choice like: improving animal genetics, sustainable agriculture, farm health and safety, increasing consumer awareness of the quality of Irish food and Irish Beef.

Videos should be submitted along with the online application form before the closing date of 18thOctober 2022.

Following an extensive interview process, 30 lucky schools will be shortlisted to present their project ideas to industry at an event in Croke Park in March 2024.

Drumcrow Tribesman show outstanding breed quality across commercial and pedigree cattle

Drumcrow Tribesman has continued to delivered huge success for Angus breeders, one of which is Fiona Troughton of the Tullybryan herd in Co. Tyrone. Her heifer calf won first prize at the Northern Ireland Aberdeen Angus National Show in Clogher Valley.

2023 saw the arrival of the first Drumcrow Tribesman offspring. The limited number of calves born to date are showing real promise across pedigree and commercial cattle. Lady Jewel then followed on to impress Bernard Keirns, judge of the NI Aberdeen Angus club herds competition, winning 1st prize in the heifer calf section, an outstanding achievement

for such a young female. This award is Fiona's first ever prize in the competition.

Bernard noted that this female and her herd counterparts "oozed with excellence of breed character, length, and size for age. Having used Drumcrow Tribesman on all her breeding females this year, Drumcrow Tribesman has done a tremendous job on various cow types".

Animal type

Know the weight and age of the Angus cattle you intend to finish. Angus steers and heifers between 17 – 20 months weighing 480-520 kg live weight will give the greatest response to indoor finishing over a 70–100-day period.

Target market

Producing animals that meet the correct carcass specification can add significant value. Angus steers and heifers should be finished at a carcass weight of between 260 kg and 350kg with a conformation score ranging from R+ to 0= and a fat score of 2+ to 4=

Efficient, sustainable beef production in the future will be paramount. Our Off-Season bonus in the future will incorporate sustainable measures such as age of slaughter, biodiversity, and genetic improvements.

Finally, supplying Angus steers and heifers 1st April 2024-7th June 2024 will guarantee members a premium of 25c per kg.

We strongly recommend all members finishing Angus cattle to avail of the certainty of this bonus

Feeding

The first step should be the silage quality. All silage should be tested prior to consideration in Winter finishing. If silage is of a lesser quality, finishing of animals may not be an option.

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
